



2018 Farm Bill SNAP Implementation Resources

After months of negotiations, the 2018 Farm Bill was re-authorized and signed into law by the President on December 20, 2018. The Farm Bill includes key provisions for improving, protecting, and enhancing SNAP. Now that the latest version of the Farm Bill is officially re-authorized, the next step is to ensure its full implementation. The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) has begun releasing information that describes SNAP related provisions, implementation dates, and implementation actions required. This section features resources and updates on implementation of the 2018 Farm Bill's SNAP provisions.
